



Bunny in a Hoodie

Crochet pattern by Kristi Tullus

Size

34 cm (13 1/2") with sport weight cotton and acrylic blend and a 2,50 mm crochet hook.

Difficulty

2. Beginner - includes more complicated crochet techniques and color changes.

Skills required

Crocheting in spiral, crocheting in rows, chain stitch, single crochet stitch, increasing and decreasing.

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Tip! You can use the same pattern to make larger or smaller toys by using finer or bulkier yarn. Pick a crochet hook at least a size smaller than suggested on yarn label and crochet tightly enough to achieve a tight gauge that will not allow the stuffing to show through the fabric. You may also need to adjust the size of the safety eyes.

Materials & Tools

- Yarn. I used sport weight cotton and acrylic blend, 50g=114m (50g=125yd) / 5 ply / 12 wpi / 2: fine. You will need about 45g of yarn for the body and 25g for the hoodie.
- 2,50 - 3,00 mm crochet hook (US size 1/B – 3/D) or according to the yarn.
- Polyester fiberfill, wool, wadding etc. for stuffing.
- 9mm (1/3") safety eyes or buttons, beads, felt etc.
- Cotton embroidery floss.
- Yarn needle, scissors, stitch marker.



Abbreviations

- **mr, sc n** = magic ring – crochet *n* (number) single crochet stitches into the adjustable loop (see page 12).
- **ch** = chain stitch.
- **sc** = single crochet stitch (double crochet stitch in UK and Australia).
- **sc (or ch, hdc etc.) n** = make *n* single crochet stitches (or ch, hdc etc.), one in each stitch.
- **inc** = increase – crochet two single crochet stitches in the same stitch.
- **dec** = decrease – crochet two stitches together using the invisible decrease method (see page 13-14).
- **sc2tog** = crochet two single crochet stitches together using the regular method.
- **(sc 4, inc) x n** = repeat the pattern between parentheses *n* times.
- **(36)** = number of stitches in a round after finishing that round.

Notes

- Work in a continuous spiral. Do not join rounds or turn your work, unless instructed otherwise in the pattern.
- Use a stitch marker or a piece of yarn to mark the end or the beginning of a round. Move the marker up after completing each round.
- All stitches are worked into both loops, unless instructed otherwise in the pattern.
